Redwood County Sheriff's Office

The Redwood County Sheriff's Office consists of 13 sworn personnel serving a population of approximately 16,059 people and covering 882 square miles. There are multiple police departments located within the county consisting of the Redwood Falls Police Department, Lower Sioux Police Department, Morgan Police Department, Lamberton Police Department, and Walnut Grove Police Department. The sheriff's office also provides contract law enforcement services to the city of Wabasso. The city of Sanborn did not renew contract services for 2018.

The sheriff's office is responsible for a number of civil/law enforcement tasks including but not limited to: civil process, criminal investigations, traffic enforcement, jail transports, court security, court ordered civil transports, search/rescue and body recovery. The sheriff's office also maintains a 24/7 dispatch center and 21 bed jail.

This report is not all inclusive but rather a summary of the Redwood County Sheriff's Office community involvement and enforcement activity.

Redwood County Jail

Redwood County has a 21 bed jail facility but the MN Department of Corrections requires the county to keep the average daily population (ADP) of the jail at just below 17. The majority of inmate overflow is housed at the Renville County Jail located in Olivia, MN. The ADP for the Redwood County Jail was lower in 2018 due to plumbing/sewer maintenance that closed the jail for over 2 months.

Drug Enforcement & Activity

Like many communities in Minnesota and across the country Redwood County has drug activity that occurs within its borders. To help combat drug activity the sheriff's office is part of the BLRR Drug Task Force which consists of Brown, Lyon, Redwood, and Renville counties. The sheriff's office has one K-9 trained in narcotics detection. Deputies also carry Naloxone (Narcan) in their squads for responding to incidents of opioid overdoses. Naloxone is a medication designed to rapidly reverse the potentially lethal effects of an opioid overdose.

BLRR Drug Task Force/Drug Seizures

The Redwood County Sheriff's Office has one full-time deputy assigned to the BLRR task force. Below are the amounts of drugs seized by the task force in 2018 (this includes all four counties).

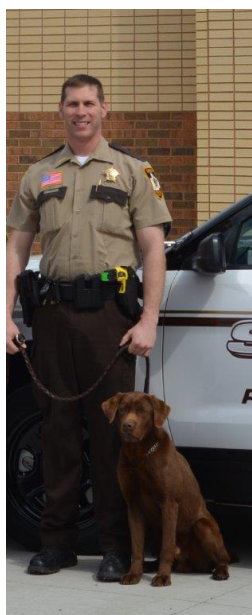

K-9 Program

The Redwood County Sheriff's Office has one K-9, Rolo and his handler Deputy Mike Campbell. Rolo is a 7 year old chocolate lab. Rolo is trained and certified in narcotics detection. Rolo is currently trained to detect 13 controlled substances. Rolo has been in service with the Redwood County Sheriff's Office since July of 2013. Rolo is utilized for school searches, search warrants, traffic stops and other incidents where controlled substances may be or are suspected to be present.

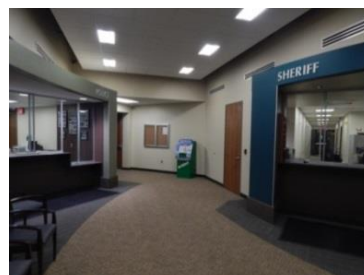
Deputy Campbell has been a K-9 handler for 18 years. He is also certified as a master trainer/instructor for K-9 handlers.

Deputy Campbell's squad is specially equipped to accommodate his K-9 partner Rolo. The squad is equipped with a "hot dog" temperature monitoring system that will alert the handler if the interior of the vehicle hits a certain temperature.

Drug Take Back Program

The Redwood County Sheriff's Office also participates in the drug take back program. Here prescription drugs can be surrendered free of charge. The drop box is located in the lobby of the sheriff's office.

Emergency Response Unit

(SWAT – Special Weapons And Tactics)

The Brown-Lyon-Redwood-Renville Emergency Response Unit (BLRR ERU) consists of deputies/officers from participating agencies within the four counties. Team members are provided with specialized equipment and training to handle high risk incidents.

Examples for activating the Emergency Response Unit are:

- High risk arrests and search warrants (armed and dangerous subjects)
- Hostage rescue
- Barricaded subjects
- Active shooter response
- Other high risk incidents where the subject is likely armed and dangerous



The Brown-Lyon-Redwood-Renville Emergency Response Unit (BLRR ERU) was activated a total of ten times in 2018. Seven of the call-outs required a tactical response. Two of the call-outs were mutual aid in the City of Granite Falls in Chippewa County. A summary of the activations are below:

January 15, 2018 – The BLRR ERU was activated to assist the Brown-Lyon-Redwood-Renville Drug Task (BLRR DTF) and Minnesota River Valley Drug Task Force with the execution of a search warrant in the City of New Ulm. Two males, a female, and two pit-bulls were secured, and the scene was turned over to the DTF.

February 14, 2018 – The BLRR ERU was activated to assist the Redwood County Sheriff's Department with the execution of a search warrant in rural Milroy related to a domestic assault with a firearm investigation. Prior to the team's arrival the suspect fled on an ATV and barricaded himself inside a storage building in the City of Milroy. The suspect failed to respond to negotiations. The suspect was ultimately taken into custody after chemical munitions, a less lethal impact munition, and taser were used.

February 16, 2018 – The BLRR ERU was activated to assist the Marshall Police Department with a suicidal male with a hunting rifle. The situation was resolved by the Marshall Police Department prior to the ERU's arrival, and the team was cancelled.

May 24, 2018 – The BLRR ERU was activated to assist the BLRR DTF with a search warrant in the City of Olivia. One male was secured, and the scene was turned over to the DTF.

June 5, 2018 – The BLRR ERU was activated to assist the Renville County Sheriff's Department with a suicidal male barricaded in a house in Sacred Heart with a rifle. The Renville County Sheriff's Department resolved the situation prior to the ERU's arrival, and the team was cancelled.

June 21, 2018 – The BLRR ERU was activated to assist the Redwood Falls Police Department with the execution of a search warrant involving a barricaded assault suspect. Crisis Negotiators were able to talk the suspect into coming out of the house, where he was secured and turned over to the Redwood Falls Police Department. The house was cleared by the ERU. Nobody else was found inside.

July 2, 2018 – The BLRR ERU was activated to assist the Fairfax Police Department and Renville County Sheriff's Department with a barricaded DANCO Violation suspect, and execution of a search warrant in the City of Fairfax. The suspect had also made a threatening statement to Law Enforcement while brandishing a knife. Crisis

Negotiators were able to talk the suspect into coming out of the house, where he was secured. ERU members cleared the house, finding no additional people.

October 6, 2018 – The BLRR ERU was activated to assist the Granite Falls Police Department with a barricaded suspect with a firearm. The Granite Falls Police Department resolved the situation prior to ERU's arrival, and the team was cancelled.

November 30, 2018 – The BLRR ERU was activated to assist the Renville County Sheriff's Department with the execution of a search warrant in the City of Sacred Heart. The suspect was a fugitive with a history of assaulting law enforcement and resisting arrest. The suspect was arrested without incident. Another male was found inside the residence.

December 7, 2018 – The BLRR ERU was activated to assist the Granite Falls Police Department with a search warrant. Three males and two females were secured, and the scene was turned over to the Granite Falls Police Department.
